Blue Glory Vine Thunbergia battiscombei

'Blue Glory' is a weak-stemmed vine that grows to 2-3' tall. It does not climb, but typically scrambles over and through nearby perennials and shrubs. Plants die to the ground in winter in USDA Zones 8 and 9, but usually will come back in spring.

Type: tropical perennial evergreen vine

USDA hardiness zones: 8 through 12

Uses: ground cover; border; hanging basket; container

Origin: not native to Florida

Height: 2 to 3 feet Spread: 3 to 6 feet

Plant spacing: 4 to 6 feet

Light requirement: full sun to part shade

Soil tolerances: sand; loam; clay; slightly acidic; slightly alkaline; wet to well-drained

Drought tolerance: moderate

Salt tolerances: unknown

Invasive potential: low to none

Pest resistance: No serious insect or disease problems
